### RAY ALLEN HEATING UP FROM DEEP...

Ray Allen has been heating up from beyond the arc during the month of March...In the 11 games so far this month he is shooting 45.8% (22-of-48) from three-point land...Until March Allen had been shooting just 34.3% from beyond the arc (97-of-283) and well below his career average of 39.8%.

### RONDO STARTING TO MAKE HIS FREEBIES...

Rajon Rondo has been inconsistent at the free throw line this season but he may be starting to turn it around...During the month of March Rondo is shooting 74.4% from the charity stripe and has made 32 of his 43 attempts in 10 games...During the first 57 games of the season, Rondo was shooting just 59.5% from the line (113-for-190)...He also is getting to the line more often averaging 4.3 trips to the line this month as opposed to 3.3 in the 57 games of the season.

### PIERCE CLOSING IN ON HAVLICEK TO BECOME FRANCHISE LEADER IN FREE THROWS MADE...

Paul Pierce is closing in on John Havlicek's record for most free throws made by a Celtic in franchise history...He currently has made 5,337 freebies in his career and is chasing #17's record with 5,369...He currently ranks 24<sup>th</sup> in NBA history in free throws made...listed below are the next targets in his sights on the NBA list and where he stands on the Celtics all-time list

### PAUL'S CHASING EDDIE...

Paul Pierce is currently shooting the best of his career from beyond the three-point arc making 44.5% of his three's this season...his previous career high came back during his rookie season when he made 41.2% of his attempts...Pierce is now chasing Eddie House's season old record of 44.4% which House set last season besting Danny Ainge's record of 44.3% that Ainge set back during the 1986-87 season.

### PIERCE PASSES HAVLICEK TO BECOME FRANCHISE LEADER IN FREE THROW ATTEMPTS...

During the game against the New Orleans Hornets on February 10, Paul Pierce attempted eight free throws and in the process passed John Havlicek to become the Celtics franchise leader in free throws attempted...He trailed Havlicek by one entering the contest and finished the game with a career mark of 6,596, besting Havlicek's mark of 6,589.

### RONDO MAKING MAJOR STRIDES IN HIS FOURTH SEASON...

Rajon Rondo has dramatically improved his overall game from his third to his fourth seasons as an NBA player...Rondo entered the season with 23 total double-doubles to his name in his first three seasons...So far during the 2009-10 season he has posted 32 double-doubles and is currently ninth in that category league-wide...He also has improved his numbers in points, assists, steals, field goal percentage and assist-to-turnover ratio...listed below are some of those figures in his career and how he has improved upon them during the 2009-10 campaign.

When the lineup of Kendrick Perkins, Kevin Garnett, Paul Pierce, Ray Allen and Rajon Rondo has been out at the opening tip-off for the Celtics they have posted a record of 119-37 since the beginning of the 2007-08 season...The Celtics have posted a record of 62-16 at home and a record of 57-21 on the road during those 156 games.

### **RONDO POSTS 30-15...**

Rajon Rondo posted 30 points and 15 assists against the Warriors on 12/28...He became just the third Celtic to ever post those numbers in a game joining Larry Bird and Bob Cousy...Both Cousy and Bird have completed that feat twice...Bird last accomplished that feat on 4/1/87 against Washington when he had 30 points, 15 assists and 17 rebounds.

### **GARNETT NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK...**

Kevin Garnett was named the Eastern Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending 12/6/09...He averaged a team-high 19.7 points to go along with 7.3 rebounds and 4.3 assists in the three games...This is Garnett's fourth time winning the award as a Celtic and his 19<sup>th</sup> time overall.

### **RONDO PRODUCES ONE OF A KIND NIGHT...**

Rajon Rondo recorded 11 points, nine rebounds, 13 assists and five steals against the Milwaukee Bucks on December 9...According to the Elias Sports Bureau; Rondo is the first Celtic to ever post those totals in a game since the NBA began tracking steals in the 1973-74 season.

### **RAY ALLEN NETS HIS 20,000<sup>TH</sup> CAREER POINT...**

Ray Allen scored his 20,000<sup>th</sup> career point fittingly on a three-pointer against the Washington Wizards (12/10)...He is the sixth player to reach that milestone as a Celtic, joining Kevin Garnett, Gary Payton, Robert Parish, Larry Bird and John Havlicek...No other team has had six players score their 20,000<sup>th</sup> career point while wearing its colors.

### **RONDO FIRST CELTIC SINCE TINY TO HAVE ASSIST STREAK...**

Rajon Rondo posted a season-high 17 assists against New Jersey on February 27 and raised his streak to six consecutive games with 10 or more assists in a game...This is the longest streak by a Celtic since Tiny Archibald had a seven game streak during the 1981-82 season...He tied franchise history by having his seventh consecutive game with 10+ assists when he recorded 11 against the Pistons on March 2, tying Archibald and Bob Cousy who posted his seven consecutive games in 1959-60.

### **ROBINSON PROVIDES INSTANT OFFENSE...**

Nate Robinson scored 14 points in 15 minutes against Detroit on March 2...It tied the most points that Nate has ever scored in an NBA game in which he played fewer than 20 minutes...He previously scored 14 points in 18 minutes on 11/1/06 against Memphis...Nate responded the next night against Charlotte (March 3) with 16 points in 20 minutes.

### **RONDO FIRST PLAYER SINCE DOUGLAS TO POST TWO 15-15 GAMES IN SEASON...**

Rajon Rondo posted 15 points and tied a season-high with 16 assists against New York on February 23...It was his second 15-point, 15-assist game of the season (had 30 points, 15 assists at Golden State 12/26)...The last Celtic to have two 15-points, 15-assist games in a season was Sherman Douglas when he had two 15-15 games during the 1994-95 season.

### **EUROLEAGUE GAME OF THE WEEK...**

Greek Champion Olympiacos, undefeated in 2010 post-season play, will take on Euroleague newcomer BC Khimki (Russia) in a game airing on NBA TV this Saturday, March 20 at 1 p.m. ET...While Olympiacos has already secured themselves a spot in the next round behind the strong play of former NBA players Josh Childress and Linas Kleiza, Khimki needs a big win over the Greek side to stay in the running for a Quarterfinal spot...NBA TV televises a Euroleague Game of the Week every Saturday at 1:00pm ET.

Glenn "Doc" Rivers is entering his sixth season as Head Coach of the Boston Celtics. He was named to the position on April 29, 2004, becoming the 16<sup>th</sup> Head Coach in franchise history.

In his first season as Head Coach of the Boston Celtics Rivers led the club to a 45-37 (.549) record as well as the teams first Atlantic Division title since the 1991-92 season.

Rivers guided the 2007-08 Celtics to their 17<sup>th</sup> NBA championship behind an NBA-best 66-16 regular season record which also was his best coaching record in a single season. During the course of the 2007-08 season he was named NBA Coach of the Month three times. He is the only Celtics coach since the award's inception during the 1982-83 season to win the award three times. He joins K.C. Jones, Jimmy Rodgers and Chris Ford as the only Celtics Head Coach's to have won the award.

Rivers is only the fourth coach in franchise history to have earned the NBA Coach of the Year Award, joining Tom Heinsohn (1972-73), Bill Fitch (who won it with Cleveland (1975-76) and Boston (1979-80)) and Red Auerbach (1964-65) for whom the trophy is named.

In Rivers' second season with Boston he led the Celtics to a record of 33-49. The Celtics finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Atlantic division, 16 games behind division winner New Jersey.

The 42-year old Rivers spent four plus seasons as the Head Coach of the Orlando Magic. In his first year at the helm in Orlando he led a team predicted by most to finish near or at the bottom of the league that included four starters who were not drafted. Rivers guided the team to a 41-41 record, and for his efforts, Rivers was named the 1999-2000 NBA Coach-of-the-Year.

Rivers served as an analyst, paired with Al Michaels, for ABC Sports coverage of the NBA during the 2003-04 season, following his release from the Magic on November 17, 2003. Overall he compiled a 171-168 record (.506) in his four-plus seasons as Orlando's Head Coach, advancing the team to the playoffs three times.

Rivers played 13 seasons in the NBA for the Atlanta Hawks (1983-84 to 1990-91), Los Angeles Clippers (1991-92), New York Knicks (1992-93 to 1993-94) and San Antonio Spurs (1994 to 1995-96). He played for three of the game's top coaches in Pat Riley, Larry Brown and Mike Fratello, and holds career averages of 10.9 points, 5.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game. His teams advanced to the NBA Playoffs 10 times, where he averaged 11.4 points, 5.9 assists and 3.3 rebounds. Rivers saw action in 864 regular season games and 81 playoff games over the course of his career.

Rivers averaged a double-double in 1986-87 (12.8 ppg., 10.0 apg.) and was selected to play in the 1988 NBA All-Star Game. He averaged a career-best 15.2 points per game in 1990-91. He scored a career-high 37 points against Seattle on February 4, 1988. He also shares an NBA single-game playoff record for most assists in one half (15 vs. Boston, May 16, 1988).

Drafted after his junior season out of Marquette by the Atlanta Hawks in the second round (31st overall) of the 1983 NBA Draft, he played the first eight years of his career with Atlanta, setting the Hawks' single-season assists record with 823 in 1986-87, and ending his stint with the team as the franchises all-time assist leader with 3,866.

- Clinched first playoff appearance as Celtics coach with a 111-108 win at Milwaukee (04/13/05).
- Led Celtics to first Atlantic Division Title since the 1991-92 season.
- Won his first playoff game as Celtics Head Coach with a 102-82 win over Indiana (04/23/05) in Game 1 of the First Round of the 2005 NBA Playoffs.
- Recorded his 250<sup>th</sup> career coaching win in a 110-108 OT win vs. Charlotte (11/8/06).
- Recorded his 100<sup>th</sup> Celtics coaching win in a 105-96 2OT win vs. Orlando (3/28/07).
- Won Coach of the Month for the Month of November 2007 after leading the Celtics to a 13-2 month.
- Recorded 300<sup>th</sup> career coaching win in a 97-93 win vs. Houston (1/2/08).
- Won Coach of the Month for the third straight month in November 2008 making him one of three coaches to achieve that feat joining Larry Brown (Philadelphia 2002-03) and Flip Saunders (Detroit 2005-06).
- Recorded 200<sup>th</sup> Celtics coaching win in a 118-86 win vs. New Jersey (1/14/09).
- Recorded 250<sup>th</sup> Celtics coaching win in a 110-105 win at Memphis (12/14/09).
