### Tux & Tennies Charity Gala

Recognized as the premier fundraising event of the Clutch City Foundation, and held on the Rockets court at Toyota Center, more than 400 annual guests wear their favorite sneakers, spend time with the Rockets team and bid on exclusive and rare autographed memorabilia in the silent auction. Since 1996, the Clutch City Foundation Tux & Tennies Charity Gala has raised over \$5 million. Proceeds from last year's Gala benefited the Bush-Clinton Coastal Recovery Fund.



Money raised for the Bush-Clinton Coastal Recovery Fund will assist the rebuilding of critical community infrastructure and services such as schools, libraries, hospitals, community health centers, as well as services for mental health along the Texas and Louisiana Gulf Coast that were most affected by Hurricane Ike.

### United Way of Greater Houston

The Rockets are committed to working with the United Way of Greater Houston in its efforts to provide a safety net for thousands of Houstonians who depend on social agencies for support. Over the past several years, Owner Leslie Alexander and Rockets employees have contributed over \$450,000 to the United Way Annual Campaign. ## Grassroots Programs

### Grassroots Basketball

Research shows that children who play sports are more likely to excel academically, as well as in every other area of their lives. That is why grassroots basketball programs comprise a large part of Rockets youth initiatives, which make it possible for thousands of children throughout Greater Houston to get involved in the game. Programs include:

#### Best Shot ... Serving Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston

The Rockets and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Houston have been in partnership for the past 14 seasons. Students at 13 branches of the Club participate in the Best Shot Basketball League, a 10-week after-school program that provides students with academic tutoring, cultural awareness workshops and drug prevention education. More than 1,400 students participate.

#### Houston Rockets Skills Camps

Continuing to expand upon grassroots basketball initiatives, the Rockets host a series of Skills Camps throughout the Season. Each camp offers specialized training in basketball fundamentals, while teaching the importance of teamwork and good sportsmanship. #### Be Fit Challenge with Memorial Hermann

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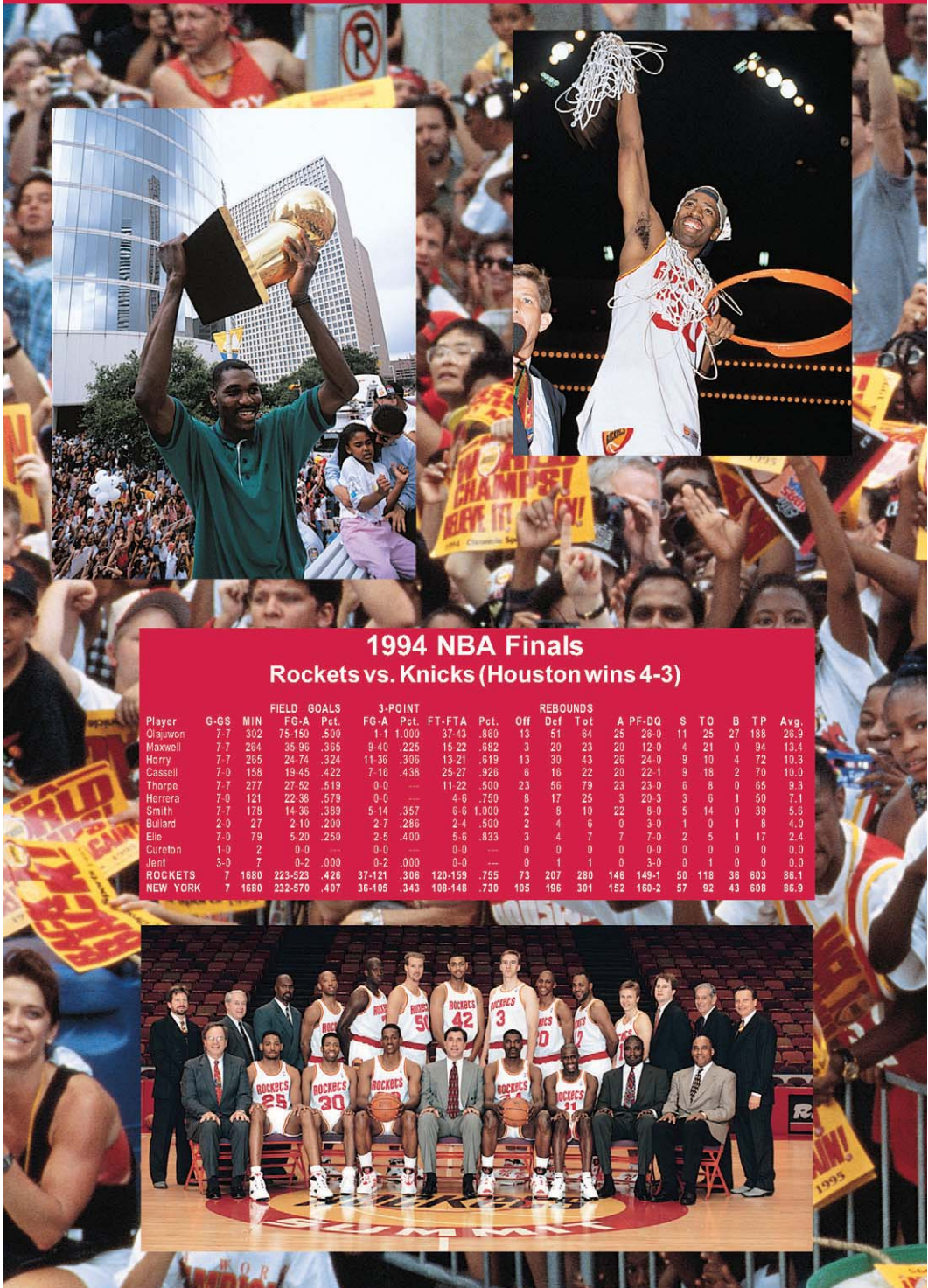

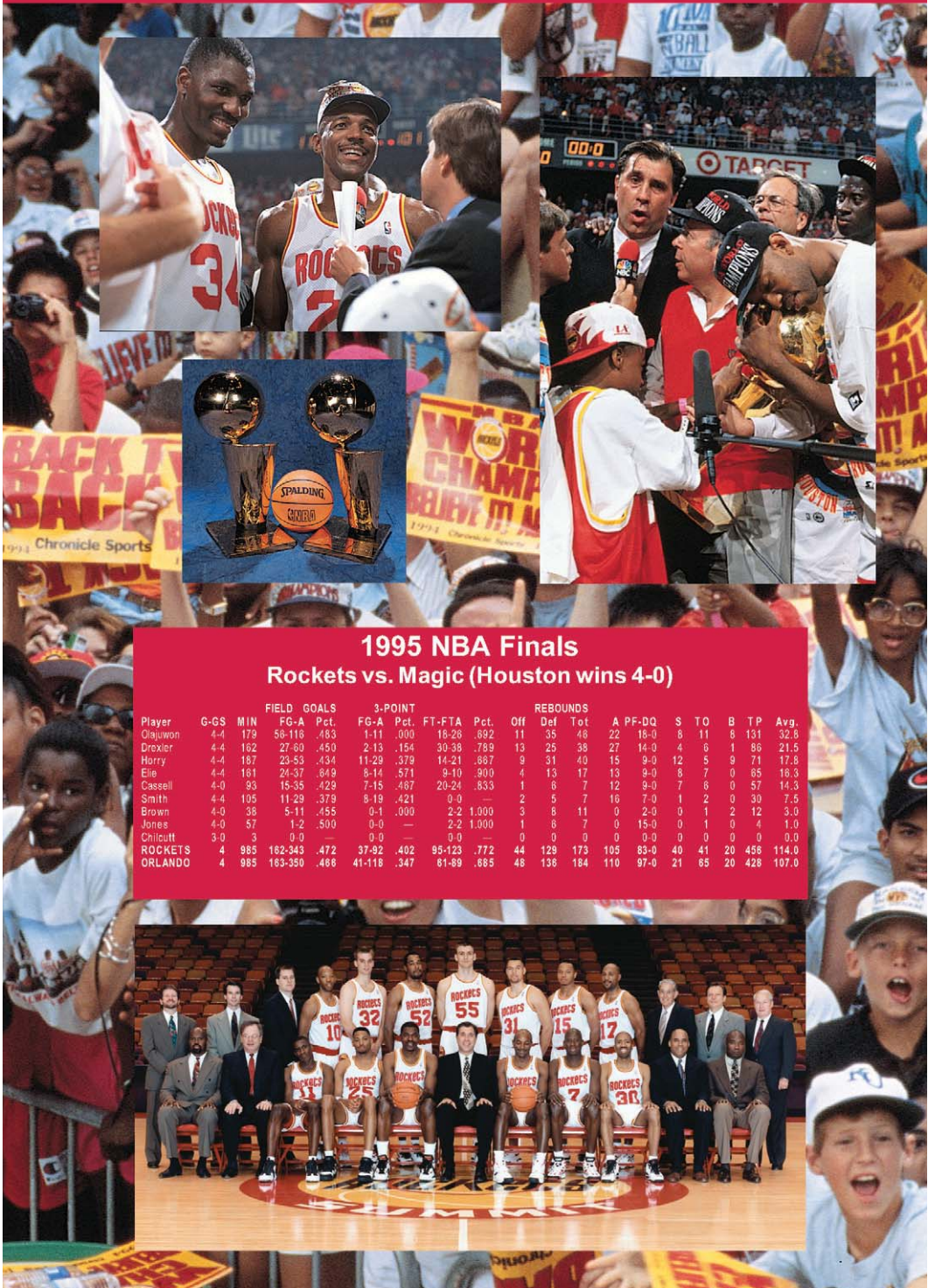
